

^{*}Getting accurate numbers for worship attendance is much more difficult to come by in the midst of a pandemic. Here is how we got to the number we had in 2021:

Jan.-March we only had pre-recorded online worship and the average attendance: 136
(With better analytics we could determine how many households watched the entire service and multiplied that number by 2.5 to give us an estimate of the number of people)

March-June we added an **outdoor "in-person"** worship to the pre-recorded worship: **155** (72% participated online while 28% participated in-person)

June-Sept. we dropped the pre-recorded worship and restarted indoor "in-person" worship with **one** blended worship that was live-streamed and recorded: **85** (36% participated online while 64% participated in-person)

Sept-Dec. we moved to **two** "in-person" worship services (traditional & contemporary) and continued to live-stream and post the recording of the service:

(34% participated online while 66% participated in-person)




Joy Lutheran Structure

2022 Auditors Report

With this report, the Auditor(s)/Audit Committee present its audit of the financial books and records of the church and all its related organizations to the Congregation Council.

Church: Joy Lutheran Church, ELCA

Synod: Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, ELCA

For the period beginning January 2022 and ending December 2022

Audit Objectives:

The audit objectives relate to the internal audit of Joy Lutheran Church financial books, records and operation include determination that:

Appropriate procedures are in place governing key financial transactions and are not being circumvented;

Controls governing the congregation's investments and bank accounts are in place and operating as intended;

All assets and liabilities recorded in the congregation's books and records are supported by independent documentation (i.e.: bank statements and vendor invoices);

All general ledgers balances are appropriately reconciled to their underlying assets (i.e.: bank statements) and liabilities (i.e.: accounts payable) in a timely manner;

All assets are properly classified in line with the donor's intent;

The Sunday (or special) offering is handled and counted in dual custody with two separate groups;

Expenses are appropriately approved and supported by the appropriate documentation;

Based on audit work performed to achieve the objectives listed above, the books and records of Joy Lutheran Church appear to be materially accurate in all respect. Testing performed also found, with any exceptions as noted in this report, that controls governing the financial operations process appear to be in place and operating as intended. Although control over financial operations appear to be adequate, additional work is needed in the following areas:

- Treasurer should have access to all church related bank statements.
- JWELCA needs to produce quarterly statements for the Council, including Bank Reconciliation, Income Statement, and Balance Sheet.

The auditor(s) has performed the procedures and testing called for in the audit program adopted by the church. In doing so, the auditor(s) has reviewed the procedures governing the financial reporting and operations process and has found the balances presented to be correct, procedures proper, and records properly kept, except as noted above.

Treasurer's Report for year 2022

A few things specific to how Joy prepares its financial statements: The church prepares its financial statements on a cash basis. The cash basis is a method of recording accounting transactions where income and expense are only recorded when the corresponding cash is received, or payments are made.

Dedicated funds are for monies given to the church for a specific purpose but may be re-appropriated by Joy's council based on the Church's needs. Restricted funds are funds established for monies given to Joy with the specific intent of being passed through to the designated organization; restricted funds may not be re-appropriated by Council.

Joy's accounting and reporting processes continue to evolve and improve. All financial reporting is generated from QuickBooks and all balance sheet accounts are reconciled on a monthly basis. We continue to focus on improving internal controls, monthly checklists, and work instructions.

The Year in Review

2022 giving started out slow during the first 3 quarters and then finished very strong during the last quarter with total giving for the year at \$365,470. This compares to total giving in 2021 of \$317,033 for a year over year increase of \$48,437. It was indeed a wonderful record setting year.

2022 expenses were held tight, even with additional expenses of \$6,000 that were not in the budget, and we still came in \$8,000 under budget with totaled expenses of \$355,742

Comparing Revenue with Expenses, 2022 ended the year with a surplus of approx.\$10,000

This was after ending the 3rd Q showing a \$21,000 deficit & 4th Q surplus of \$31,000

Of the \$31,000 4th Q surplus, December gave us a single monthly surplus of \$28,000

Note 1: Loan was refinanced in 2016 with a 10 year adjustable interest rate of 4.125%. Refinancing fee of \$9,031 was added to the principal in February 2016.


2022 Giving Team



Enter our church's name or use the invite code and click **Search**. Then, select our church.




2. Select Your Fund and Amount

Service Team - 2022 Annual Report

"Be doers of the word and not hearers only"

Joy Lutheran Church provides needed services in our church, our community and our world.

Below is a list of some of the known services that the people of Joy happily provide:



Following the pandemic in 2022 Malawi experienced severe flooding resulting in economic crisis and high risk for cholera. Each fall Joy members of all ages make and sell nearly 200 pies providing funds for Malawi.

*At Christmas members bought ELCA Good Gifts: chickens, school supplies, medical care and other gifts that were given to those in need around the world.

*Lutheran World Relief distributed quilts to the needy, quilts that Joy members have hand sewn.

*Twice a year a Joy team prepares and serves some of the 3,000 meals that Sharing and Caring Hands in Minneapolis provides weekly to those in need.

*Members donate money, food, and time to the Prescott Food Pantry, which provides food support to those in the Prescott area.

*After getting a small taste of homelessness by sleeping outdoors at their Shanty Town, Joy's youth prepared gift bags containing warm socks, hats, mittens and other essentials that can be easily shared at a stop light and with people in need.

*The Compassion Fund of Joy gave \$4066.51 to 10 families for housing, utilities, groceries and gas. The funds were donated by individuals and from the annual Plant Market to a total of \$5230.

*Intercessors pray confidentially for the needs of others as prayer requests become known.

*Joy gladly shares building space with the ADRC and Pierce County Social Services for support group meetings, with the Red Cross for blood drives and other community groups in need of space.

*Youth and adults volunteer with Teens Encounter Christ, helping provide weekend spiritual growth retreats for youth in the local and Twin City areas.

*Joy's women hosted a lunch during a synod wide women's event that included a wonderful program. They also hosted a Bible Study for all churches in Prescott.

*Wednesday Suppers are prepared and served at Joy. All from the community are welcome to come and eat or pick up a meal to take home. Volunteers help Kelly plan, shop, prepare, serve and clean up delicious, nutritious meals.

*Those experiencing loss, illnesses or other special needs are provided with meals, financial and spiritual support by individual members of Joy as needs are made known.

*Confirmation students gladly help with projects at Joy, and in the community for which they also get service hours.

*The Butterfly Garden and Labyrinth were dedicated as a place for reflection. Master Gardeners and others sow the seeds, plant the flowers and water and weed this special place that is in memory of loved ones. The entire community is welcome to enjoy the Labyrinth and Garden.

*Building and Grounds crews clean, make minor repairs, mow the lawn and shovel snow.

*Men prepare and serve a twice monthly breakfast for about ten men at a Saturday Men's Bible Study.

*Thrivent members write grants for Thrivent Action Teams that provide funds for Wednesday meals, Caring and Sharing Hands and special events sponsored by Joy.

*Sunday fellowship time is enhanced by muffin makers, coffee brewers and dish washers.

*Adults and youth help with the Sunday School.

*Adults serve as small group leaders for confirmation.

*Adults work as chaperones for youth group activities and events.

*On Sundays children, youth and adults usher, read the lessons, and distribute communion.

Technology assistants make sure the sound equipment is working and the Sunday services are videoed. Music teams prepare for and lead worship or provide special music. The Welcome Desk is staffed to provide information to visitors as they stop by.

The words above are the Purpose Statement for the Women of the ELCA, an organization to which **all** the women of Joy Lutheran Church belong. This is the purpose of the Joy Women of the ELCA and this is what guides all our actions and activities. In past years we were involved in many activities that helped us grow in faith, engage in ministry and action, affirm our gifts as women, and promote healing and wholeness in our church, the society, and the world. But in 2022, much like it was in 2021, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, our activities were very limited due to our inability to get together in person. We missed our monthly Bible studies, many of our weekly Quilting sessions, our mission projects, our annual Treats and Treasures sale which helped us raise monies for mission projects and church projects, and some of our special programs, retreats, and conventions with the women of our St. Croix Conference and our Northwest Wisconsin Synod.

We were able to host two Bible Studies in 2022. On August 8 we hosted the annual Ecumenical Bible Study for women from all the churches in the Prescott area. Twenty women in all attended the study called "Crafted in Christ." This study used the concept of quilting to explore themes of community and Sabbath. Quilting concepts and terms helped us delve into the specifics of Christian life and community and reimagine what we may become for Christ. Several women also shared quilts that they made or own. The ecumenical leaders for this study were Kathy Sommer from Joy, Cheryl DeMuth from St. John's UCC, and Jennifer Christensen of St. Joseph's Catholic Church. Truly a special group of ecumenical leaders! We also hosted an Advent Bible Study on December 13. The name of the study was "Good Things Come in Small Packages: Moving from Wanting to Waiting at Advent. Thanks to Pastor Carol Peterson for leading this study of the word and discussion about Advent and its meaning for our lives.

The women of our church were also invited to host the Fall Retreat of the St. Croix Valley Conference on Saturday, September 17 at our church, followed by lunch in the Fellowship Hall. Because of Covid, our St. Croix Conference women had not been able to get together in the last 2-3 years so they were happy to meet again for fellowship, food and fun! Our speaker was Gaye Lindfors, an author and speaker from St. Paul. She spoke on "Learning to Move from Messy Moments to Happy Places." Gaye helped us rediscover how to create great moments, which turn into great days, which turn into a great life! Special thanks to Kelly Poff and Susan Metcalf for preparing the lunch for this event.

Although many JWELCA activities and monetary gifts were suspended in 2022, the women of the JWELCA Card Ministry have continued to provide cards to people who would like to send them to people who are ill, in grief, or who are celebrating a special holiday or occasion. The cards are available in the hallway near the church office. Our Joy Quilters were able to return to quilting. About 10-12 women quilt at church each Wednesday, 9-noon, in the fall and winter. They usually complete about 45 quilts which are given to Lutheran World Relief to be sent across the world to people in need of warmth and comfort. JWELCA has also continued to sponsor a child in Kenya through the "His Arms" orphan ministry. A total of \$360 was sent in 2022 for the support of our child, Sara. This ministry was established by Nancy Rowe, a former member of Joy. JWELCA also made a 2022 contribution of \$1000 to the Luther Park Camping Program. JWELCA and our Joy Youth held a Cookie Walk in December. With the help of our Joy Youth, the Cookie Walk raised \$657.60. Thanks to all who contributed many delicious cookies!

The Women of Joy Lutheran Church are busy, dedicated, and committed to living out our purpose. We are blessed to be a community of women growing in faith, affirming our gifts, and supporting one another in our callings as we engage in ministry and action and promote healing and wholeness. We invite ALL women of our church to join us in fulfilling our purpose!
