

*Getting accurate numbers for worship attendance is much more difficult to come by in the midst of a pandemic. Here is how we got to the number we had in 2021:


Jan.-March we <u>only</u> had **pre-recorded online** worship and the average attendance: **136** (With better analytics we could determine how many households watched the entire service and multiplied that number by 2.5 to give us an estimate of the number of people)

March-June we added an outdoor "in-person" worship to the pre-recorded worship: 155 (72% participated online while 28% participated in-person)

June-Sept. we dropped the pre-recorded worship and restarted indoor "in-person" worship with one blended worship that was live-streamed and recorded: 85 (36% participated online while 64% participated in-person)

Sept-Dec. we moved to **two** "in-person" worship services (traditional & contemporary) and continued to live-stream and post the recording of the service: **136** (34% participated online while 66% participated in-person)

2023 Auditors Report

With this report, The Auditor(s)/Audit Committee present its audit of the financial books and records of the church and all its related organizations to the Congregation Council.

Church: Joy Lutheran Church, ELCA

Synod: Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, ELCA

For the period beginning January 2023 and ending December 2023.

Audit Objectives:

The audit objectives relate to the internal audit of Joy Lutheran Church financial books, records and operation include a determination that:

Appropriate procedures are in place governing key financial transactions and are not being circumvented.

Controls governing the congregation's investments and bank accounts are in place and operating as intended.

All assets and liabilities recorded in the congregation's books and records are supported by independent documentation (i.e.: bank statements and vendor invoices).

All general ledger balances are appropriately reconciled to their underlying assets (i.e.: bank statements) and liabilities (i.e.: accounts payable) in a timely manner.

All assets are properly classified in line with the donor's intent.

The Sunday (or special) offering is handled and counted in dual custody with two separate groups.

Expenses are appropriately approved and supported by appropriate documentation.

Based on audit work performed to achieve the objectives listed above, the books and records of Joy Lutheran Church appear to be materially accurate in all respects. Testing also found that, with any exceptions noted in this report, that controls governing the financial operations process appear to be in place and operating as intended. Although control over financial operations appear to be adequate, we recommend the following:

- A monthly disbursement report should be presented to the church council listing: Payee, Amount, and Purpose
- 2. Small receivables on the books be pursued or written off with church council approval.

The auditors have performed the procedures and testing called for in the audit program adopted by the church. In doing so, the auditors have reviewed the procedures governing the financial reporting and operations process and have found the balances presented to be correct, procedures proper and records properly kept, except as noted above.



Treasurer's Report for year 2023

Information on how Joy prepares its financial statements:

The church prepares its financial statements on the cash basis. This is a method of recording accounting transactions where income and expenses are recorded when the corresponding cash is received and payments are made.

Dedicated funds are for donations given to the church for a broad purpose and may be reappropriated by Joy's council based on the church's needs. Restricted funds are established for donations given to Joy with a specific intent and purpose and may not be re-appropriated by Council.

Joy's accounting and reporting processes continue to evolve and improve. All financial reporting is generated from QuickBooks and all balance sheet accounts are reconciled on a monthly basis. We continue to focus on improving internal controls, monthly checklists, and work instructions.

The Year in Review

2023 revenue started out slow during the first 3 quarters and then finished very strong during the last quarter (December revenue was \$70,049) with total giving for the year at \$364,735. This is very comparable to the total of \$365,470 last year. It was indeed another wonderful end to the year and start for new year.

2023 expenses were held tight, and we came in \$17,000 under budget with total expenses of \$352,905. Comparing Revenue with Expenses, 2023 ended the year with a surplus of \$12,000.

Service Team – 2023 Annual Report

Many acts of service by Joy members are humbly provided and go unrecognized, thank you for all that you do. The following is a list of some well-known services and projects that Joy Lutheran Church provides in our church, our community, and our world.

- Our sister church in <u>Malawi</u> benefits from our prayers and financial support. Each fall Joy members of all ages make and sell nearly 200 pies for Malawi.
- During the Christmas season members bought ELCA <u>Good Gifts</u>, of chickens, school supplies, medical care and other gifts that were given to those in need around the world.
- Lutheran World Relief distribute quilts to the needy, quilts that Joy members have hand sewn.
- Twice a year a Joy team prepares and serves some of the 3,000 meals that <u>Sharing and Caring Hands</u> in Minneapolis provides weekly to those in need.
- Members donate money and food, and time to the <u>Prescott Food Pantry</u>, that provides food support to those in the Prescott area.
- The <u>Compassion Fund</u> of Joy provides emergency funds to families for housing, utilities, groceries and gas. The funds were donated by individuals and from the annual Plant Market.
- Intercessors pray confidentially for the needs of others as prayer requests become known.
- Joy gladly shares building space with the <u>ADRC for support group meetings</u>, with the <u>Red Cross</u> for blood drives and other community groups in need of space.
- Youth and adults volunteer with <u>Teens Encounter Christ</u>, helping them with provide weekend spiritual growth retreats for youth in the local and Twin City areas.
- Joy's women hosted a Bible Study for all churches in Prescott.
- <u>Wednesday Suppers</u> are prepared and served at Joy. All from the community are welcome to come and eat or pick up a meal for take home. Volunteers help Kelly plan, shop, prepare, serve, and clean up delicious, nutritious meals.
- Those experiencing loss, illnesses or other special need are provide with meals, financial and spiritual support by individual members of Joy as needs are made known.
- Confirmation students gladly help with projects at Joy, and in the community for which they get service hours.
- The entire community is welcome to enjoy the Labyrinth and garden that memorializes loved ones.
- Building and grounds crews, clean, make minor repairs, mow the lawn, and shovel snow.
- Men prepare and serve a twice monthly breakfast for about ten men at a Saturday Bible.
- Thrivent members write grants for <u>Thrivent Action Teams</u> that provide funds for Wednesday meals, Caring Sharing Hands and special events sponsored by Joy.
- Sunday fellowship time is enhanced by muffin makers, coffee brewers and dish washers.
- Adults and youth help with the Sunday school, adults serve as small group leaders for confirmation and work as chaperones for youth group activities and events.
- On Sunday morning children, youth and adults usher, read the lessons, and distribute communion. Technology assistants make sure the sound equipment is working and the Sunday services are videoed. Music teams prepare for and to lead worship or provide special music. The Welcome Desk is staffed to provide information to visitors as they stop by.

JWELCA Annual Report for 2023



As a community of women Created in the image of God Called to discipleship in Jesus Christ And empowered by the Holy Spirit We commit ourselves to Grow in Faith Affirm our Gifts Support one another in our callings Engage in Ministry and Action, and Promote Healing and Wholeness in the Church, The Society, and the World.

The words above are the Purpose Statement for the Women of the ELCA, an organization to which **all** the women of Joy Lutheran Church belong. This is the purpose of the Joy Women of the ELCA and this is what guides all our actions and activities. In past years we were involved in many activities that helped us grow in faith, engage in ministry and action, affirm our gifts as women, and promote healing and wholeness in our church, the society, and the world. But in 2023, much like it was in 2021 and 2022, due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, our activities were limited due to our inability to get together in person.

Although many JWELCA activities and monetary gifts were suspended in 2023, the women of the JWELCA Card Ministry have continued to provide cards to people who would like to send them to people who are ill, in grief, or who are celebrating a special holiday or occasion. The cards are available in the church narthex. Our Joy Quilters were able to continue their quilting mission. About 10-15 women quilt at church each Wednesday, 9-noon, in the fall and winter. They usually complete about 45 quilts which are given to Lutheran World Relief to be sent across the world to people in need of warmth and comfort. JWELCA also contributed to Lutheran World Relief \$100 in costs to ship the quilts. JWELCA has also continued to sponsor a child in Kenya through the "His Arms" orphan ministry. A total of \$360 was sent in 2023 for the support of our child, Sara. (This ministry was established by Nancy Rowe, a former member of Joy.) JWELCA also made a 2023 contribution of \$1300 to the Luther Park Camping Program which helped several Joy children attend the camp last summer. JWELCA also committed to disburse \$250 for Prescott School District feminine products. JWELCA and our Joy Youth held a Cookie Walk this fall. With the help of our Joy Youth, the Cookie Walk raised \$657.60. Thanks to all who contributed many delicious cookies!

JWELCA is meeting again every 2-3 months. Please join us for those meetings where we have discussed the WELCA model constitution and bylaws, received a report on JWELCA's tax exempt status, shared the *"Northwester Newsletter"* for our Synod Women, discussed "Special Offerings" for special projects, and made plans to conduct, with Pastor Melissa's help, a Bold Women's Sunday on March 3rd. Women's Bible Studies resumed last December. Special thanks to Pastor Melissa for leading the studies on the first Tuesday of every month at 1:30 p.m. and the following Wednesday at approximately 7:15 pm. following the Wednesday evening church service. All women are invited to attend either session.

The Women of Joy Lutheran Church are busy, dedicated, and committed to living out our purpose. We are blessed to be a community of women growing in faith, affirming our gifts, and supporting one another in our callings as we engage in ministry and action and promote healing and wholeness. We invite ALL women of our church to join us in fulfilling our purpose!

How were we faithful in in ministry? How were we faithful in participating in God's simple mission to love our neighbor? Let each of you look not to your own interests but to the interests of others. spired your ministry! Give thanks to God and celebrate for the good that your congregation has accomplished!

Now is also the time to tell the truth about your ministry. How has your congregation fallen short and not been faithful to God's will? Lacked energy, a sense of purpose or mission? Now is the time to humbly tell the truth if your congregation has lost its focus or has little energy for God's work.

We all need to take an honest look in the rear view mirror of the last year and ask how have we been faithful and how have we failed to be faithful to our baptismal promises. Then we can boldly move into the New Year 2024 asking how we can with God's help do better.

The Church of England took a long look into the rear view mirror and with much prayer has discerned that moving forward they will strive to be a Simpler, Humbler and Bolder Church in the future. The Church of England described their vision for the future in this way:

Simpler, humbler, bolder are virtues we believe God is calling from us at this point in our history. They run through the vision and shape all we do and all that we are.
-Simpler because we are not as big a church as we used to be
-Humbler because we are facing our failures, and this is not easy.
-Bolder because the love of Christ compels us. We have a gospel to proclaim, and we live and minister in a world of much pain and confusion.

I believe these three virtues could also help us in the coming year. I invite your councils and leaders to lean into these questions in 2024:

- **1. Simpler**: How can we simplify our structure so more time and energy can be spent on loving our neighbors and joining in God's mission in our community? How can we focus on what is really important and let go of the trivial or unnecessary?
- **2. Humbler**: What isn't working? How have we fallen short? We can't do everything we use to do so what ONE thing can we do for Jesus? How can we work with other churches, denominations in our community?
- **3. Bolder**: How can your congregation be braver and bolder in sharing the good news about Jesus in a hurting world? In prophetic witness to justice issues in our world? In working for right relationships with our neighbors and all of creation?

Friends, I am truly grateful for your partnership in the gospel and all the ways you are faithful in ministry. I invite you to move joyfully, simply, humbly and boldly into God's future in 2024.
