Pray: Light a candle and open your devotion time with a prayer.

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

"Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. (John 2:11)"



Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.
